## Structure, governance and management

### Type of governing document

Innerleithen Pipe Band is an unincorporated association governed by a constitution adopted by the Band in 2002.

The Band is governed by a management committee elected annually from its membership by the Band's AGM.

The Band is led musically by a Pipe Major, Leading Drummer and a Drum Major who are elected annually from its membership by the Band's AGM

### Trustee recruitment and appointment

Trustees are elected annually for a period of 1 year by the Band's AGM. Any member of the Band is eligible to stand for election. Trustees resign at each AGM but are eligible for immediate re-election.

### Objectives and activities

#### Charitable purposes

The objects of the band shall be to advance the education of the public in the art of Bagpipe Playing and Drumming by the presentation of public performances and other related activities. In furtherance thereof but not otherwise the band shall seek:

- a) To promote pipe bands and the playing of pipe band music
- b) To form and maintain a competition pipe band
- c) To compete at the highest possible grade in competition
- d) To maintain membership of the Royal Scottish Pipe Band Association or its successor organisation
- e) To provide tuition and education in the playing of bagpipes and drums
- f) To do all other things as are charitable in law for the attainment of these
  - The Band held regular weekly practices from late May 2021 onwards when the Covid-19 were relaxed, and band activities could resume.
  - The Band attended two playing engagements during the year, in November and December. All playing engagements and competitions prior to this were cancelled

- The Band continued its membership of the Royal Scottish Pipe Band Association (RSPBA).
- The Band managed to hold one in-person fundraising event in October.
- The Band participated in "virtual" events throughout the year.
- The Band participated in two live in-person performances late in the year when Covid-19 regulations allowed.
- The Band commenced preparation for the 2022 pipe band competition season in the hope that such a thing will happen.
- There are no further achievements to report as the Band was forced to suspend all activities between January and May due to the various states of lockdown imposed by the Government due to the Covid-19 situation.

## Financial review

Brief statement of the charity's policy on reserves

The Band's constitution states that the Band must hold a minimum of £50 in its bank accounts. As at 31/12/2021 the band held general unrestricted reserves of £15,435.00, and restricted reserves of £3225.00 for the purpose of uniform replacement.

The band holds reserves to enable it to meet on-going running costs and asset purchases to enable it to continue with its activities.

The band has a designated fund for the purpose of refurbishing and maintaining the Band Hall, sited in Hall Street Innerleithen. As at 31/12/2021 the fund held £2070.00.

Details of any deficit

The deficit of £1874.00 in 2021 was due to expenditure exceeding income - the Band has undertaken expenditure on replacement uniforms long delayed by the Covid-19 situation.

The Band is composed entirely of volunteers who donate their time freely to attend practices, playing engagements and competitions. Band members also volunteer to administer the band.
